Today people are afflicted with such colorfully named aches and pains as Space Invaders wrist, dog walker's elbow and slot-machine tendinitis.

Not nearly so technical is Dr. William N. Mebane's explanation of dogwalker's elbow. It seems his dog Hogan, who prefers to walk on Dr. Mebane's left side, was constantly tugging at the leash to sniff bushes, benches, poles, other dogs, assorted cats—anything, in fact, that whetted his curiosity. Each tug created pressure on the doctor's left elbow, causing soreness. When he shifted the leash from the left hand to the right, he simply transferred the problem.

Dr. Mebane says the best cures are a long leash or disciplining the dog to stay close at all times.

Dogs Make Scents Of Cable Leaks

"Dog Credited With Averting NYC Blackout," The headline is fictitious; the idea is not.

A research program conducted by Southwest Research Institute (ŚwRI) of San Antonio, Texas, for Power Technologies, Inc., has yielded the information that dogs can be trained to sniff out dielectric fluid leaking from buried cables—long before the leak becomes severe enough to cause a serious problem such as a blackout.

On a recent test sniffing expedition in New York City, two specially trained dogs were able to detect minute quantities of dielectric fluid in the air so accurately that they could pinpoint the location of underground leaks within five feet of their source.

As a result of the test run, Power Technologies has contracted with SwRI to keep the dogs' suitcases packed and ready for a flight to New York, in case new leakage problems arise.
