FELINE BRAGS

Alice Crans writes about her Birman cat whom some of you have met.....

While many of you know Kiki is a therapy cat, how many of you know she came by her title honestly? Yes, Virginia, there is a Feline Good Citizen (FGC) Test!) And a bona fide temperament test for cats?

The Cat Fanciers' Association in concert with Bash Dibra – trainer to the stars, developed the Feline Good Citizen Test. It consists of an evaluation of 1) how the cat behaves when approached by a friendly stranger (kids aren't used...); 2) the cat should allow a quiet, calm stranger to pick it up (no kids), it should be clean with trimmed claws and should be calm when being brushed (except by children) and – the cat must go readily into the carrying case when asked (for this last test I find children are useful).

The temperament test adds that the cat must allow itself to be harnessed (so you can find it when children scare it under a dresser), must remain calm in the face of loud noises, etc (done after the children have scared it under a chair), allows itself to be placed on the lap of a gentle stranger (not a child) and – allows herself to be carried through a crowded room.

Quite seriously Kiki is and does and has passed all these tests – and even after being used each and every week at Pier 94 from September through January (a two week break in there someplace), she is still a warm and loving cat. Talk about crowded rooms! She was carried literally for hours through dense hordes of people and dogs, was jumped on by a keeshond (no reaction) hair pulled out by a child (did try to struggle on that one) and only growled once at a shepherd (who looked like it wanted to share her pouch!).

Both Kiki and Topaz were given an award by the NJ Veterinarians Foundation for their work at the Pier. And both were absolutely wonderful. While Kiki doesn't have quite enough white on her front paws for show, she is one truly exceptional feline. I give you:

Shelhaven's Xena Kahlua Koala, FGC, AATCR (Animal Assisted Therapy – Crisis)

Special Accomplishment

2002 – Kahlua was placed in the Hall of Fame in the Special Recognition category for her extensive work at Pier 94 in NYC after 9/11 by the NJ Veterinary Foundation. Kiki was one of only three cats to serve at any of the centers, and was the only one to participate from the beginning to the closing. Kiki was also cited for her efforts by Commissioner O'Keefe, Mayor Guiliani's representative in charge of the Family Assistance Center.

Directions:

From the East: I-78 to Exit 16 (Route 31 North). * Take Rt. 31 north - as you approach the second light, stay to the right as jug handle takes you off onto Route 513 at the 513 - Grayrock Shopping Center - at the STOP sign turn right and note mileage at this point. Follow Rt. 513 to and through High Bridge. Shortly past Voorhees High School, turn left onto Rt. 628. There is an old, unopened Sunoco gas station on the corner. This turn will be 3.9 miles from the light on Rt. 31. Follow Rt. 628 to full stop at Hill Rd. Turn left. Watch for brick buildings on the left - first a firehouse, then the Municipal Building, then the First Aid Squad. (Total mileage from light on Rt. 31 is 5.7 miles). Park in the rear of the buildings.

From the West: I-78 to Exit 15. Right at end of ramp. Take Main Street into the town of Clinton. At the light in the center of town, turn left onto Halstead Street (Route 513).
