




'm happy to report that the Gloucester County Kennel Club successfully ran an AKC sanctioned tracking match on July 8 (I was the chairman/secretary), and we will now be planning a tracking test, probably for some time in the fall of 2008. As a result, several of our members seem interested in learning more about tracking, and we're having Sue Ammerman present a program on tracking at our November meeting. I'm also hoping to run a "Tracklaying 101" seminar to get GCKC people ready to help with the test. I have a lot of good ideas for it thanks to attending Lenape's tracklayer certification last year.

As far as the dogs go, I don't have much tracking news, but Sooty qualified for the AKC Agility Invitational and will be listed in Front & Finish's First and Foremost for 2006 obedience. He had three clean runs (out of three) at the AKC Nationals in March and finished 46th out of 217 dogs in the twelve inch class. He finished his MACH2 on June 30 and earned his NF and OF (Novice and Open FAST) titles this spring, along with his USDAA PK1 and PJ1 (Performance 1 Snooker and Jumpers) and his NADAC EJC (Elite Jumpers). He was the third Schipperke to get a MACH2 and the first to get an OF. Gracie finished her NF and her PK1 and PJ1.

We've been working hard on obedience (and Gracie's weave poles!) over the summer, but we sure are looking forward to getting back to tracking as the weather gets cooler!

## History of AKC Tracking SAKC's website gives a brief history of

tracking. Tracking was originally part of the UD obedience title. In order to earn the utility title, a dog had to pass a separate tracking test. The first obedience trial was held in 1936. Tracking remained a part of the utility title until 1947 when it was made into a separate class.

During these first ten years tracking was described in one paragraph that gave basics on the length and age of the track. The day of the test, the tracklayers walked the track, dropped the article and retraced their steps so they could remove all but the first two flags. In 1938, the rules were amended to say that the tracklayer could not wear rubber soled shoes and at the dog was to be on a 30-40 foot lead and work without assistance. In 1943 another amendment stated that the tracklayer was to walk directly off the track.

When tracking was made a separate class in 1947, the regulations adopted required the tracklayer to wear leather-soled shoes until they dropped the article. At that point, they were to put rubbers on and walk off the track at a

right angle. The article was to be a

glove or wallet.

The TDX test became effective in 1980, and the VST in 1995. There are now about 45 pages of description and regulation for tracking.
